THE START OF SPLASHES

Splashes of Hope was founded in 1996 by Heather Buggée in reaction to her own experience in typical, dreary medical settings. During her art school years, Heather had a friend that was afflicted with Hodgkin's Disease and was an inpatient in a local hospital. Heather and her friend often discussed ways to improve the hospital's aesthetics. Their idea that positive imagery and an appealing environment would improve a patient's spirit and attitude, and support the healing process, was the genesis of Splashes of Hope.

Heather's friend, sadly, did not survive his illness, but their dream lived on.

Heather and her team have turned the dream into reality as Splashes Of Hope continues its mission to improve lives and bring happiness to patients and facility residents.

Our Splashes grace locations as far away as the Ukraine, and right in your hometown.

Splashes of Hope is a family-run organization!

Heather Buggee created Splashes of Hope with a vision to uplift the hospital environment, inspired by an experience with a hospitalized friend to have the medical environment more conducive to the healing process. Heather is the Founder and CEO (meaning Creative Endeavors Only) of Splashes of Hope. Heather is also the Master Mural Artist at Splashes - one can visually see her passion and creativity through each and every mural project. As she says after every project, 'this is the best one yet!'

Sarah grew up in the art studios carrying buckets of water up and down the stairs and cleaning up messes (just like a Samurai's apprentice), and eventually began painting Splash murals. Sarah started a Splash Chapter in California and eventually came back to New York to work on the various on-going projects. Five years later, she is now the Executive Director. Although Sarah has 'suited up' for the job and has since left the art studio, she finds creativity in collaboration with the Splash Team, and expanding on new ideas and programs.

Jimmy Knapp is an ambassador and a driving force with everything Splashes: from projects, events, and teams, among the many other categories. Jimmy is a superstar in the Splash World, always on the move and one step ahead in every way. He has also driven all across the country in the Splashmobile for Splash projects.

Mural Projects

This is the essential part of our mission!
Our artists create customized mural work for healthcare centers and social service facilities.

Our team meets with healthcare staff to assess the sites for murals and find the best theme for them.

Murals are painted on removable Masonite panels, and painted with non-toxic water-based acrylic paints.

Our artists will **feature a logo or custom image for our sponsors** whimsically into the mural (such as on a sailboat, tree engraving, etc.). The logo or tribute will also be featured on our website, email blasts, and social media posts.

Murals are viewed publicly, oftentimes by **THOUSANDS of people**

Since 1996, Splashes of Hope has accumulated over 100 healthcare centers on our WAITING LIST seeking funds for mural projects

There are dozens of themes to choose from: creating murals for children, adults, and veterans

Here are examples of Splashes of Hope murals:



Peaceful park scenes are a popular theme to provide soothing visualization for viewers. Corresponding images of families in the park highlights culture and diversity. Healthcare centers oftentimes request local scenes and landmarks of the facility's surrounding location, acclimating viewers to the community.



Splashes of Hope initially created murals primarily for children. Here are examples of I-Spy themed artwork to captivate the viewer, and to be used as a tool for engagement between the hospitalized patient and healthcare staff.





Below are murals created for veterans centers and residencies to uplift VA patients and residents, depicting a soothing, whimsical scene featuring small highlights of military service and imagery.

Celebration of Life

Creating murals in tribute to a loved one, an anniversary, or coming of age

(For example: we created murals funded by our board members' wedding, with the murals being dedicated to memory of his dad, and brightening the nursing home the dad)







Splash Stars

- Creating special murals for the bedrooms of children with serious medical conditions
- Our Team meets with the child and their guardians to see what they would like in their special mural (for example, 3 year old Ronnie's mural: his whole family is featured in a race car!). Their custom mural is installed within their bedroom or family area.











Mission Expansion

Creating customized murals in public spaces to brighten communities and neighborhoods. The latest theme of murals due to COVID-19 are murals created as a permanent, long lasting tribute to healthcare and essential workers:



Splashes of Hope murals are typically painted on removable Masonite boards ranging in varying sizes depending on the location being 'Splashed.' The largest artwork is 4'x8' in size, while smaller focal points vary to 4'x4,' 3'x3,' 2'x2,' and so on. Murals are also painted directly on walls as well. All murals are painted with non-toxic water based acrylic paint and coated with sealants to ensure integrity and high-quality protection of the artwork.



Painting for a Purpose

Painting for a Purpose is an interactive mural painting activity where attendees will experience painting murals alongside our professional artists. The murals being painted will be professionally painted and completed by Splashes of Hope artists, and donated to a local healthcare center to have a long-lasting impact on patients and staff. Events are typically two-hours long (whether a casual team gathering or a formal gala).











Friend on the Mend





Friend on the Mend is a custom coloring book created by Splashes of Hope artists for hospitalized children. The story tells about 'Alice Elephant' who fell off her bike, broke her tusk, and had a visit to the hospital. Alice's friend 'Vincent Van Monkey' went to visit her in the hospital, and painted a special mural to lift her spirits. The story shows the mission of Splashes of Hope, as well as to acclimate children into the medical environment. Each gift set comes with one Friend on the Mend coloring book, one animal hand puppet, a packet of crayons, and an interactive I-Spy foldout called 'Secret Splashes,' featuring a Splashes of Hope mural.







Adopt-A-Wall: Virtual Activity!

Purpose

Creating mural work to brighten and uplift healthcare centers, social service facilities, or neighborhoods: while having a fun, engaging experience for attendees with a meaningful give-back purpose! PLUS not only are you working with our non-profit, but you are also helping another non-profit or neighborhood in need...simultaneously helping two organizations!

Process

- Sponsor selects a location from the <u>National Waiting List</u> (or other location of choice) for a mural project
- 2. Splashes of Hope team creates a mural project (includes site visit(s), painting, installation, etc.)
- **3. Splash Happy Hour Event** (one-hour duration)
 - Introductions
 - Behind-the-scenes video of the project
 - Interviews with artists, mural recipients, and sponsors
 - Q&A segment

- Engage clients/team members to create design(s) for mural(s)
- Professional painting workshop catered to all levels of experience


FRIENDS HELPING KIDS: A VIRTUAL ACTIVITY











Secret Splashes





Information on Coindre Hall



Coindre Hall, originally called West Neck Farm, is a 40-room, 80,000-square-foot (7,400 m²) mansion in the style of a medieval French château constructed in 1912 for pharmaceutical magnate George McKesson Brown. The home was designed by Clarence Luce, a Paris architect. [2] It overlooks 34 acres (14 ha) of rolling land including a boathouse on the north shore of Long Island adjacent to Long Island Sound. The home was designed for George McKesson Brown of the McKesson pharmaceutical family. George, a Huntington Fire Commissioner for 29 years before his retirement from in 1960, was the elder half-brother of race car driver David Bruce-Brown. Brown could not keep up with the maintenance of the mansion and sold it in 1939. t the request of Bishop Monsignor Thomas Molly, the Brothers of the Sacred Heart bought this property to establish a boarding school and summer retreat. It was founded by Brother Martinian, S.C., Provincial Superior, and was named in memory of Father André Coindre, the founder of the Brothers of the Sacred Heart. The school was intended to generate funds for the formation and education of young Brothers. The boarding school operated by the Brothers of the Sacred Heart closed on June 30, 1971 due to lack of teachers. Since 1973, Coindre Hall Park has been administered by the Suffolk County Department of Parks, Recreation & Conservation.

This project was made possible thanks to the supporters from the Virtual Bay Cruise.






